Donald E. Purcell is a recognized international expert in the field of private sector global technology standards. For more than 25 years, he has advised corporations, government departments and agencies, international standards development organizations, and universities on the strategic implications of private sector global technology standards, their potential effects in the marketplace and their relationship to government standards.

Since 2000, Mr. Purcell has chaired The Center for Global Standards Analysis in Washington, D. C., a think tank dedicated to helping corporate executives, government policy makers, university faculty, and students understand the strategic implications of private sector global technology standards. He is a member of the adjunct faculty at the Catholic University Columbus School of Law for Cyber Law. He is also a member of the adjunct faculty at the Catholic University School of Engineering for Strategic Standardization.

In 2004, Mr. Purcell chaired the United States Standards Strategy Committee Subgroup 3, Education and Communication, which contributed to the revision of the National Standards Strategy for the United States, leading to publication of the United States Standards Strategy in 2005.
